



MEMBER CODE OF CONDUCT

INTRODUCTION

The intention of this document is to establish clear and acceptable behavior expectations for Wingham Golf Club members, guests and visitors. It is not intended to restrict the rights of anyone but rather to ensure that all members, guests and visitors can expect to be treated with respect while enjoying the Wingham Golf Club golf course and clubhouse.

The club deems that upon payment of membership or green fees, all members, guests and visitors have given their consent to be bound by both the restrictions and penalties imposed by this code of conduct.

CODE OF CONDUCT

All members, guests and visitors will:

- Conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner and will not knowingly cheat or throw clubs nor will they disrespect employees, Board members or fellow competitors;
- Respect the rights of other players and golf course staff by not verbally or physically threatening or slandering others, either personally or through social media;
- Not engage in any form of sexual, racial or religious discrimination or harassment;
- Adhere to the dress code and observe proper golf etiquette;
- Observe both AGA rules of golf and the local rules of the course;
- Respect the golf course, golf carts and facilities;
- Adhere to all club rules including
 - sign-in procedures in the Golf Shop;
 - rental and safe operation of carts;
 - directions displayed on signage around the golf course;
 - taking pride in the physical appearance of Wingham Golf Club;
- Not conduct themselves in any rude or immoral manner including the use of profane language, gestures, insults or other such misbehavior;
- Abide by all state and local laws and regulations including the possession of any illegal drugs and weapons on the property of Wingham Golf Club;
- Be an ambassador for Wingham Golf Club in the community or at other clubs because all members are considered representatives of Wingham Golf Club.

RESOLUTION OF VIOLATIONS

- Should a violation take place, it will be put on the agenda of the next Board of Directors meeting.
- In all cases, should there be any damage to property, monetary restitution will be mandatory as a condition for continuing membership.
- After discussion, the Board of Directors will offer the member or guest an opportunity to state his/her case.
- The Board will then determine the nature and extent of any penalties which could include temporary or complete loss of membership or playing privileges.
